Terms & Conditions

Behavior Policy: To ensure a safe and fun environment for all, children are expected to behave in an acceptable manner and use appropriate language at all times. It is important to remember that there are no refunds if a child is asked to leave the program due to unacceptable behavior.

Lunch Policy: Each child is expected to bring their lunch, refillable water bottle and snacks each day to camp. Meals will not be provided.

Children will not be allowed to bring backpacks, tablets, phones or other items to camp.

Emergency Treatment Authorization: You hereby authorize the diagnosis and treatment by a qualified and licensed medical professional, of your child, should a medical emergency occur, which the attending medical professional believes requires immediate attention to prevent further endangerment of the minor's life, physical disfigurement or impairment, or undue pain, suffering or discomfort, if delayed.

Permission is granted to the attending physician to proceed with any examination, diagnosis and medical or minor surgical or other treatment. In the event of a medical emergency, you understand that every attempt will be made by the attending physician to contact you in the most expeditious way possible. The authorization is granted only after a reasonable effort has been made to reach you.

Permission is also granted to the Community Health Action Center and its affiliates to provide emergency treatment prior to the child's admission to the medical facility. This release is authorized and executed of your own free will, with the sole purpose of authorizing medical treatment under emergency circumstances, for the protection of life and limb of the named minor child, in your absence.

Liability Waiver: On your own behalf, and as parent or guardian, you acknowledge and agree that there is the possibility of physical injury or loss associated with your child's participation in the program and hereby release and discharge the Community Health Action Center, its affiliated organizations, employees and associated personnel including the owners of the program facility against any and all claims, liabilities and/or damages as a result of your child's participation in the program.



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Photo Release: You authorize the Community Health Action Center to obtain, store, publish and/or use (without payment) any photographs, slides, sound and/or video recordings made of your child for public relations, marketing/advertising and/or internal training purposes.

Pick-up Policy: To ensure a safe and fun environment for all, children are expected to be picked up at the close of camp each day by the designated Parent/Guardian or Alternate Transportation. Children will not be released to other parties. Failure to pick up a child in a timely manner may result in a child being dismissed from the program.

It is the goal of the Community Health Action Center (CHAC) Camp OAKS to provide a healthy, safe, and secure environment for all camp participants. Camp OAKS teaches the core values of honesty, caring, respect, and responsibility. Children who attend camp are expected to follow the Code of Conduct below and to interact appropriately in a group setting.

- We are all responsible for our actions.
- We respect each other and our environment.
- Honesty will be the basis for all relationships and interactions.
- We will care for ourselves and those around us.
- No use of profanity, offensive language, or name-calling (i.e., If it doesn't make someone feel good or better about themselves then it shouldn't be said) will be tolerated.
- No physical aggression, e.g., hitting, kicking, pulling, fighting, spitting, etc.
- Be enthusiastic, thoughtful, open-minded, and involved.
- Treat others as you would like to be treated.
- Listening & paying attention is mandatory for a safe and fun camp.
- Complete respect for all equipment, facilities, and grounds is expected.
- All clothing worn shall be within the bounds of decency and in good taste. No halter tops, tube tops, bare backs, or shirts that show cleavage or excessively baggy or tight-fitting clothes will be acceptable.
- No electronics allowed. We will not take the electronic but call the parent/caregiver to pick the child up.

Disciplinary Procedures:

When a camp participant does not follow the Code of Conduct, we may take the following steps:

1. Staff will redirect the child to more appropriate behavior.
2. The child will be reminded of the behavior guidelines and camp rules, and a discussion will take place.
3. The Camp Director will be notified of the problem and meet with the child.
4. If the behavior persists, a parent will be notified of the problem.
5. If a problem persists and a child continues to disrupt the Camp program, Camp OAKS reserves the right to suspend or remove the child from camp. If this were to happen, Camp OAKS will not grant a credit or refund for any camp payments.
6. The following behaviors are not acceptable and may result in the immediate and indefinite suspension of a camp participant:
 - Behaviors that endanger the health and safety of children and/or staff, volunteers, and members.
 - Stealing or damaging CHAC Camp OAKS, off-site, or personal property.
 - Leaving the camp program without permission.
 - Continuous disruption of the program with consistent disrespect.
 - Refusing to follow the behavior guidelines and/or camp rules.
 - Acting in a lewd manner.

No Refunds will be issued for campers who are suspended or expelled. Children who are suspended, expelled, or whose illness prohibits participation must be picked up from camp within 30 minutes of notification. The CHAC Camp OAKS reserves the right to modify, repeat, accelerate steps, or not use the outlined processes as the situation demands. The CHAC Camp OAKS is not responsible for loss or theft of personal property.

Parent/Guardian Expectations: Parents and Guardians are expected to be reachable within a reasonable amount of time. Failure to be reachable may result in the dismissal of the child/ren.
